KENYA THE SITUATION

Violence erupted in Kenya after the re-election of President Mwai Kibaki on December 30, 2007. The disputed election triggered a deadly conflict between Kibaki supporters and those of Raila Odinga.

BY THE NUMBERS

- ▶ More than 1,000 people killed
- ▶ More than 300,000 displaced

ADRA'S RESPONSE

In early January, ADRA Kenya provided aid for 1,000 people in Nairobi. Working with church and government agencies, and Kenya Red Cross, ADRA Kenya provided emergency assistance.

Over the last month, ADRA Kenya and its partners have worked in the provinces Nairobi, Rift Valley, and Nyanza to:

- ▶ Distribute more than 320 metric tons of food to 81,000 displaced people.
- ▶ Help displaced persons return home, while providing food, water and

sanitation, clothing, blankets, medicine, and counseling.

- ▶ Begin constructing water and sanitation facilities for 30 orphanages.

ADRA International has shipped donated clothing and medical supplies. A portion of the medicines will go to Kendu Adventist Hospital in the Rift Valley. Medical teams are providing care in affected communities.

ADRA Kenya will continue to monitor and assess the situation and respond to the humanitarian needs of Kenyans affected by the violence.

CHAD THE SITUATION

In a coup attempt that began February 2, in the capital, N'Djamena, rebels have killed hundreds of civilians, injuring more than 1,000. An estimated 200,000 Chadians have fled their homes.

ADRA'S RESPONSE

ADRA is assessing the needs of those affected by the developing situation in Chad, and plans to distribute basic supplies.
